What do I need to get started?

Clubs come in a myriad of shapes and sizes. There is no one-size-fits-all checklist! But there are folks who have walked this road ahead of you.







Designed to prime your planning, this **Club Launch Top 10** is built on success stories shared by club leaders around the league. We pray the ideas captured here will generate needful questions and aid you on your own club leadership journey.

Club Launch Top 10

1. Purpose

Is the NCFCA Christian Speech and Debate league a good fit for you?

Our mission is to challenge and equip ambassadors for Christ to communicate truth with integrity and grace.

Does NCFCA align with your club vision?

- NCFCA Statement of Faith
- NCFCA Position Statements
- NCFCA Values

In order to affiliate, families *must certify that they have read and agree with* the NCFCA Statement of Faith and Position Statements.

2. People

Consider your club makeup. What will the club community look like?

- You and a friend, learning alongside your children
- A few families creating a small club co-op
- A large group of families creating a larger learning community
- An after-school program

Whom will you serve?

- NCFCA "Senior" Competitors (ages 12-18)
- NCFCA "Juniors" Competitors (generally for students 7-11 years old)
- Families with small children in tow
- Seasoned NCFCA families with a wealth of experience
- Brand new NCFCA parents





3. Meetings

What could your club setting look like?

- Where
 - o In a home, a coffee shop, a library, a church, a school, etc.
 - o In person, online, or using a combination of the two
- When
 - Weekly, biweekly, monthly, etc.
- Structure
 - Independent group
 - Subgroup operating in conjunction with an existing co-op
 - School program
- Parent involvement
 - Parents stay at your club to learn alongside the students and serve alongside other parents
 - Dropoff program

4. Competition

What competition <u>categories</u> would you like to study with your students?

- Speech
 - Interpretive Speaking (Biblical Thematic, Duo Interp, Open Interp, Original Interp)
 - Platform (Digital Presentation, Informative, Persuasive)
 - Limited Prep (Apologetics, Impromptu, Extemp)
- Debate
 - Policy Debate
 - Value Debate
- Moot Court

What do NCFCA competition events look like? Are they a good fit for you?

- NCFCA offers Speech, Debate, and Moot Court competition.
- Tournaments are in person and online.







- Typical qualifying tournaments are three-day events (tournaments range from one-day to five-day events).

5. Teaching Tools

What tools will guide your instruction?

- League / Clubs / Education: Learning Resources, League Policies, and Other Tools

6. Plug into NCFCA

How do you help your club members connect to NCFCA?

- Connect with your Regional Director (look under Region # Team).
 - She will be an excellent resource for you!
 - Club leader calls are offered by your Regional Director. These are a great way to connect with other club leaders and learn more about what's happening in your part of the country!
- Clubs associate with NCFCA to stay connected to league happenings.
 - Fill out NCFCA's Club Information Form to stay connected.
 - There is no fee to associate your club with NCFCA.
- Families <u>affiliate</u> to compete in NCFCA tournaments.
- Once families are affiliated, check in with them to make sure they are seeing weekly email communication from NCFCA Communications,







and encourage families to explore the resources housed on NCFCA's website.

7. Tournament Season

How do you help your club prepare for the season?

- Learn about NCFCA together! Encourage all club members to carefully read the League Information & Connections information found on the NCFCA Resources page (click on League / Clubs / Education tab), starting with:
 - Mission and Foundational Beliefs
 - League Policies
 - Affiliation Options and Pricing
- Help your club get ready for their first tournament!
 - Visit NCFCA's Tournament Prep page to learn about:
 - Account Setup
 - Registration
 - Payment
 - Check In
 - Model for your club parents how to find and use their <u>NCFCA</u> dashboard to register for events.
- If you've been around NCFCA for a season already, tell them about your tournament experience!

8. Other Considerations

Depending on the context and size of your club, what else might you need to think about?

- Who will share the load?
 - Will parents learn alongside their students?
 - Will you teach classes or provide the students with accountability?
 - Do you have NCFCA competitors or alumni who can teach with you?
- What frameworks might you need in place for club management?
 - Communications email, social media, texting apps
