

Moot Court Round Script and Clerk Instructions

Moot Court Round Script

The Courtroom Clerk will not begin to read the script aloud until all judges for the round are present. Once all judges are present, the Courtroom Clerk will confirm the Chief Justice. When the Chief Justice confirms the judges are all ready, the Courtroom Clerk begins the script below.

Bringing the Round to Order

Courtroom Clerk:	Oyez, oyez, oyez. (O-yea). The Supreme Court of the United States is now in session, the Honorable Chief Justice presiding. All those having cause to be before this honorable Court draw nigh and pay heed. God save the United States, and God save this honorable Court.			
Chief Justice:	e only case on the docket today is Cobi Mendax, titioner vs. The State of Palidosa, Respondent. Is the titioner ready?			
Petitioners:	[First advocate says:] The Petitioner is ready, your Honor.			
Chief Justice:	Is the Respondent ready?			
Respondents:	[First advocate says:] The Respondent is ready, your Honor.			
Chief Justice:	You may proceed. [First Petitioner should wait until receiving some indication, such as a nod, from the Chief Justice that the Court is ready to proceed.]

Requesting Additional Time to Complete an Argument or Answer a Question

• If an advocate's time expires before completion of the argument, the advocate may request additional time from the Chief Justice with the following question:

Advocate: Mr./Madame Chief Justice, I see that my time has expired.

May I have a moment to conclude? [BRIEFLY conclude.]

• If a question is pending or the advocate is in the middle of answering a question, the advocate may request additional time with the following question:

Advocate: Mr./Madame Chief Justice, I see that my time has expired.
May I have a moment to answer the question and briefly
conclude? [BRIEFLY finish answering and BRIEFLY
conclude.]

• In either case, it is up to the Chief Justice's discretion whether to allow additional time. The advocate need not request additional time to finish his sentence, though—he can simply finish his sentence and say thank you.

Adjourning the Round

Courtroom Clerk: The Honorable Court is now adjourned.

[The justices should exit the virtual room by clicking on the exit button in the upper right corner of the screen.]



Clerk Instructions

Preparation for the Round

Please enter the room as soon as rooms are opened by the Tournament Administration. Ideally, this will be about 10 minutes before the round is scheduled to begin. Please test your microphone and camera immediately upon entering. Your video will remain on throughout the round unless there is a technical issue. You will need to mute and unmute your microphone as designated below.

Set timer (phone or timepiece) to 1:00 minute in preparation for Protected
Time notification detailed below.
Preliminary rounds will have one (1) justice and elimination rounds will
have three (3) justices.

Verify Justices are Ready

Once the expected judges are in the competition room,

Open the Round

Once the justice(s) confirm they are ready, announce:

Oyez, oyez, oyez*. The Supreme Court of the United States is now in session, the Honorable Chief Justice ______ presiding. All those having cause to be before this honorable Court draw nigh and pay heed. God save the United States, and God save this honorable Court. [Mute your microphone.]

Track Protected Time

The clerk is responsible for tracking and indicating the end of the protected speaking time at the beginning of each speaker's oral argument. The competitors will track their own total speech time, indicating to the justice(s) when their time has expired and requesting more time if appropriate.



^{*(}Oyez is pronounced "oh-yay")



With the exception of the rebuttal, the first minute of each speech is protected from interruption from the Justices.

☐ Start the one-minute countdown when each speaker begins.		
☐ When the minute has expired, turn on your microphone and clap twice		
(loudly) to indicate to the judges that they may now interrupt and ask		
questions. [Mute your microphone.]		

Moot Court Speeches	Time
Petitioner 1	Up to 10 minutes, as reserved
Petitioner 2	Up to 10 minutes, as reserved
Respondent 1	10 minutes
Respondent 2	10 minutes
Rebuttal from either Petitioner 1 or 2	Up to 4 minutes, as reserved

Adjourn the Round

At the end of the round, announce:

The Honorable Court is now adjourned. [Turn off your camera and microphone. Exit the room.]
